REPORTS

Mr. Robinson reported that Abigail Keiser, an Oxford student, and senior in the Health Career Pathways program, will serve as the Skills COUNTY INTERMEDIATE USA vice-president this year. Skills USA is a program that empowers its members to become world-class workers, leaders and responsible adults.

Mr. Robinson also reported that Dr. Noreen O'Neill, Mary Curley and Sandra McCabe accompanied several students from area school districts to Beijing, China for the 31st annual International Young Physicists Tournament July 19-26, 2018.

REPORT OF CHESTER UNIT AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL The students were from Coatesville, Octorara and Phoenixville Area School Districts and won the opportunity to attend the 2018 IYPT over a team from Princeton Regional Institute of Science and Math.

Dr. Owens reported that the Legislative Council met and the following legislation has passed.

- Act 158, Keystone Exams-formerly SB 1095: Provides alternative Pathways for graduation for students who do not demonstrate proficiency on a Keystone exam during years when Keystones area a graduation requirement.
- Act 105, Sunscreen Use-formerly HB 1228: Requires school entities to allow "the outdoor use by a student of sun-protective clothing: and the "possession, application or use by a student of a non-aerosol topical sunscreen product without a physician's note."
- Act 82, Certificate Grade Spans-formerly HB 1386: Requires all special education certificates issued after December 2021 to be Pre-K through 12 or up to age 21. Teachers holding K-6 or 7-12 certificates will be able to expand their certificate through coursework and assessments developed by the Department of Education.
- Act 156, Executive Session-formerly SB 1078: Amends the Open Meetings Law to extend permissions extended to school districts in the School Code bill passed with the 2018-19 state budget.
- Act 159, School Bus Cameras-formerly SB 1078: Amends the Vehicle Code to allow for the installation of automated side stop signal arm enforcement systems on school busses to capture information on vehicles that fail to stop.
- Act 119, Student Services-formerly HB 2052: Requires school districts to offer families the option of communicating that a parent/guardian is a member of the armed forces. Upon notification of deployment of parent/guardian, the school district would be required to provide the student with access to school guidance counselors and existing federal or state support services.

Ms. Watkins reported on her experience at the Chester County Intermediate Unit training for student representatives.

During American Education Week students in the elementary levels wrote about the importance of public education. There was also a parent/family/guardian/grand-parent visitation, and student athletes from the high school came into the elementary schools and read to the students. Student in the elementary schools made cards and gave chocolate to the bus drivers.

At Nottingham and Penn's Grove, Red Ribbon Week involved students in anti- bullying and staying drug free presentations.

Jordan Bank's parent teacher conferences on November 15, 2018 were rescheduled due to weather. They will now be held Thursday, November 29, 2018.

Elk Ridge students earned over 4,500 Bee Tickets in the month of October for the school-wide positive behavior program.

Students attended a special dance assembly sponsored by Oxford Center for Dance. This is an annual event and many of our students are involved in the performance.

Penn's Grove seventh grade students participated in a "Cruising Smart" assembly on October 23, 2018 where they learn about distracted driving.

The Penn's Grove volleyball team played against the teachers on November 1, 2018, where the teachers were victorious.
