## OXFORD AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT

The board recognizes that parent/guardian and family engagement contributes to the achievement of academic standards by students participating in Title I programs. The board views the education of students as a cooperative effort among the district, schools, parents/guardians and community.

In compliance with federal law, the district and parents/guardians of students participating in Title I programs shall jointly develop and agree upon a written parent/guardian involvement policy. When developing and implementing this policy, the district shall ensure the policy describes how the district will:

- 1. Involve parents/guardians in the joint development of the district's overall Title I plan and the process of school review and improvement.
- 2. Provide the coordination, technical assistance and other support necessary to assist participating schools in planning and implementing effective parent/guardian involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.
- 3. Develop activities that promote the schools' and parent/guardian's capacity for strong parental involvement.
- 4. Coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies with appropriate programs as provided by law.
- 5. Involve parents/guardians in an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the policy in improving the academic quality of schools served under Title I.
- 6. Identify barriers to participation by parents/guardians who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy or are of any racial or ethnic minority.
- 7. Identify the needs of parents/guardians and family members to assist with the learning of their children, including engaging with school personnel and teachers. Identify strategies to support successful school and family interactions.
- 8. Use findings of annual evaluations to design strategies for more effective parent/guardian involvement.

9. Involve parents/guardians in the activities of schools served under Title  ${\it I.}$ 

The board shall adopt and distribute the parent involvement policy which shall be incorporated into the district's Title I plan and shall be evaluated annually with parent/guardian involvement.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's Title I parent/guardian engagement policy, plan and programs comply with the requirements of federal law.

The building principal and Title I staff shall provide to parents/guardians of students participating in Title I programs:

- 1. Explanation of the reasons supporting their child's selection for the program.
- 2. Set of objectives to be addressed.
- 3. Description of the services to be provided.
- 4. Provide translated materials and interpretation services.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that information and reports provided to parents/guardians are in an understandable format and to the extent possible, in a language the parents/guardians can understand.

## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

## TITLE I PARENT INVOLVEMENT

An annual meeting of parents of participating Title I students shall be held to explain the goals and purposes of the Title I program. Parents/guardians shall be given the opportunity to participate in the design, development, operation and evaluation of the program. Parents/guardians shall be encouraged to participate in planning activities, to offer suggestions, and to ask questions regarding policies and programs.

In addition to the required annual meeting, additional parent/guardian meetings shall be held at various times of the day and evening. At these meetings, parents/guardians shall be provided with:

- 1. Information about programs provided under Title I.
- Description and explanation of the curriculum in use, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
- 3. Opportunities to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children.
- 4. Opportunities to submit parent/guardian comments about the program to the district level.

If sufficient, Title I funding may be used to facilitate parent attendance at meetings through payment of transportation and childcare costs.

Opportunities shall be provided for parents/guardians to meet with the classroom and Title I teachers to discuss their child's progress.

Parents/guardians may be given guidance as to how they can assist at home in the education of their child.

## School-Parent Compact

Each school in the district receiving Title I funds shall jointly develop with parents/guardians of students served in the program a School-Parent Compact. This compact will outline the manner in which parents/guardians; school staff and students share responsibility for improved student achievement in meeting academic standards. The compact shall:

 Describe the school's responsibility to provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment, enabling students in the Title I program to meet the district's academic standards.

- 2. Indicate the ways in which parents/guardians will be responsible for supporting their children's learning, such as monitoring attendance, homework completion, and television watching; volunteering in the classroom; and participating, as appropriate, in decisions related to their child's education and positive use of extracurricular time.
- 3. Address the importance of parent/guardian-teacher communication on an ongoing basis through, at a minimum, two parent/guardian-teacher conferences and monthly reports to parents/guardians, literacy nights and reasonable access to staff.

In accordance with Federal law, the Title I administrator shall release to parents/guardians, upon request, information regarding the professional qualifications and academic degrees of any teacher providing instruction to their child at a school receiving Title I funds. The administrator shall annually notify parents/guardians about their right to request such information.

The Title I administrator shall notify parents/guardians of students attending a Title I school when their child has been assigned to or taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified, as defined by Federal law.
